All submitted articles must address a key health problem, contain the rigor emphasized in the editorial statement of NRL, and articulate managerial relevance. Review Procedure:

Manuscripts will be reviewed in a manner consistent with the NRL editorial policy, with the review team consisting of the guest editor, associate editors, and reviewers selected by the AEs.
