Astronomische Nachrichten / Astronomical Notes (AN) is published in an online only format.

Print subscription and single-issue sales are available from Wiley's Print-on-Demand Partner. To order online click through to the ordering portal from the journal's Subscribe and Renew page.

1. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Papers published in AN shall present the results of original research not previously published. Articles submitted to AN should meet these criteria and must not be under consideration for publication elsewhere.

Papers must be written in English. While a polished literary style is not demanded of scientific papers, they should conform to the elementary rules of grammar, syntax, and punctuation. All papers are being sent to referees. There are no page charges.

NEW: Once the submission materials have been prepared in accordance with the Author Guidelines, manuscripts should be submitted online via the webbased submission and reviewing system ScholarOne Manuscripts.

Steps for Using the Online Submission System

On the journal's homepage, click the 'Submit an Article' option on the right-hand side menu to open the ScholarOne Manuscripts homepage or use the link ScholarOne Manuscript Submission.

- Please check first whether you already have an account. If you are unsure, or have forgotten your password, follow the instructions on the log-in screen.
- 2. If you're a first-time user, use the 'Create An Account' link to create an account.
- 3. The submitting author (only) is required to provide an ORCID iD when submitting their manuscript.

- 4. Log-in and select "Author".
- 5. Click the "Start New Submission" link.
- 6. Enter data and answer questions as prompted.
- 7. Click on the "Save & Continue" button on each screen to save your work and advance to the next screen.
- 8. You are required to upload your files (for instructions on file types see section 2):
 - Click on the "Select File" button and locate the file on your computer.
 - Select the designation of each file in the dropdown menu next to the "Select File" button.
 - When you have selected all files you wish to upload, click the "Upload Selected Files" button.
 - To finish the file upload step click on the "Save & Continue" button at the end of the page.
- 9. Review your submission (in PDF format) before sending to the Editors. To finish your submission click the "Submit" button.

Be sure to enter all of your funder and grant information during the details & comments step. This helps us ensure you meet all of your funder requirements.

Data Sharing and Data Availability

This journal encourages data sharing. Authors are asked to provide a data availability statement to describe the availability or the absence of shared data. When data have been shared, authors are required to include in their data availability statement a link to the repository they have used, and to cite the data they have shared. Whenever possible the scripts and other artefacts used to generate the analyses presented in the paper should also be publicly archived. If sharing data compromises ethical standards or legal requirements then authors are not expected to share it.

Funding

All listed authors should have contributed to the manuscript substantially and have agreed to the final

submitted version. Review <u>editorial standards</u> and scroll down for a description of authorship criteria.

ORCID

Reproduction of Copyright Material

If excerpts from copyrighted works owned by third parties are included, credit must be shown in the contribution. The corresponding author is responsible for obtaining written permission to reproduce the material "in print and other media" from the publisher of the original source, and for supplying Wiley with that permission upon submission.

2. PREPARING YOUR SUBMISSION

File Types

LaTeX files should be prepared using the **AN journal stylefile**. The LaTeX template can be downloaded here: AN_LaTeX_template.zip.

In exceptional cases also accepted:

- LaTeX files coded with any other class without particular packages or definitions. You are free to use the <u>generic template</u> available via the Authorea platform for preparing your manuscript.
- Submissions in Word format. A generic Word template can be found here.

LaTeX Submission

Initial submission: LaTeX manuscripts must be submitted as a PDF generated from the source files, fonts included, no T3 fonts allowed. You must use the File Designation "Main Document" from the dropdown box. At this stage, further source files are not required.

Revision: When submitting your **revision** you must still upload a separate PDF that you have generated from your revised source files. You must use the File Designation "Main Document" from the dropdown box.

Important: Please note that when uploading a revised version of your files you need to delete the previous version first.

In addition, you must <u>upload your TeX source files</u>. For all your <u>source files</u> you must use the File Designation "LaTex source files".

Please be aware that the source LaTeX code will be converted to XML, as this is an essential prerequisite for online publication. The XML version will then be used to create the final output in the final layout.

Figures

Figures should preferably be submitted in full color but should also be easily readable on a black/white printout. Color figures are reproduced in color at no cost.

LaTeX authors are welcome to include their figures and graphics as PostScript-files (*.eps) using the graphicx package. Each EPS file should be one page only (multipage files are unacceptable).

Alternatively, upload each figure as a separate file in either TIFF, EPS or JPG format. Compound figures e.g. 1a, b, c should be uploaded as one figure. Tints are not acceptable. Lettering must be of a reasonable size that would still be clearly legible upon reduction, and consistent within each figure and set of figures. Where a key to symbols is required, please include this in the artwork itself, not in the figure legend.

Keywords

Papers have to be accompanied by key words. These are published together with the paper and must be chosen from the current <u>list of keywords</u> (up to five items).

Acknowledgments

Contributions from anyone who does not meet the criteria for authorship should be listed, with permission from the contributor, in an Acknowledgments section. Financial and material support should also be mentioned. Thanks to anonymous reviewers are not appropriate.

Footnotes

Footnotes can be placed at the foot of each page. They should be referred to in the text with consecutive, superscript Arabic numerals. Keep footnotes brief; they should contain only short comments tangential to the main argument of the paper and should not include references.

Tables

Tables should be self-contained and complement, not duplicate, information contained in the text. They should be supplied as editable files, not pasted as images. Legends should be concise but comprehensive - the table, legend, and footnotes must be understandable without reference to the text.

All abbreviations must be defined in footnotes. Footnote symbols: †, ‡, §, ¶ should be used (in that order) and *, **, *** should be reserved for P-values. Statistical measures such as SD or SEM should be identified in the headings.

Appendices

Appendices will be published after the references. For submission they should be supplied as separate files but referred to in the text.

Supporting Information

Supporting information is information that is not essential to the article but provides greater depth and background. It is hosted online and appears without editing or typesetting. It may include tables, figures, videos, datasets, etc. Note: if data, scripts, or other artefacts used to generate the analyses presented in the paper are available via a publicly available data repository, authors should include a reference to the location of the material within their paper.

Supplementary material can be cited as part of the original article e.g.

[enter citation here]. see online supporting information S1-S5.

You may include captions for supplementary figures, tables or videos at the end of your manuscript.

Please use suitable compression technology to avoid exceedingly large movie files (>10 MB) for the benefit of

referees' and readers' bandwidth and storage capacity. Also, please make sure that your movies are saved in a common format (such as MPEG, AVI, QuickTime, GIF) that can be played on at least two different computer platforms (out of Windows/ MacOS/ Linux).

Please choose the File Designation "Supporting Information for Review" on the File Upload screen. Click here for Wiley's FAQs on supporting information.

Peer Review

This journal operates under a single-blind <u>peer review</u> <u>model</u>. Papers will only be sent to review if the Editors determines that the paper meets the appropriate quality and relevance requirements.

All contributions will be evaluated according to the standard procedures of peer review. To facilitate the refereeing process, you may provide the names and email addresses of referees capable of reviewing your manuscript. 3. AFTER ACCEPTANCE

First Look

After your paper is accepted, your files will be assessed by the editorial office to ensure they are ready for production. You may be contacted if any updates or final files are required. Otherwise, your paper will be sent to the production team.

Copyright and Licensing

When an accepted article is received by Wiley's production team, the corresponding author will receive an email asking them to login or register with <u>Wiley Author Services</u>. The corresponding author will be asked to complete a license agreement on behalf of all authors. Authors may choose to publish under the terms of the journal's standard copyright agreement, or <u>Open Access</u> under the terms of a Creative Commons License.

Standard <u>re-use and licensing rights</u> vary by journal. Note that certain funders mandate a particular type of CC license be used. Proofs

Authors will receive an e-mail notification with a link and instructions for accessing HTML page proofs online. Early View

- 1. Images that contain text and line art (graphs, charts, maps, etc.) will reproduce best if saved as EPS or PDF. Please remember to embed fonts. This ensures that any text reproduces exactly as you intend.
- 2. Images that contain photographic information are best saved as TIFF or PNG, as this ensures that all data are included in the file. JPEG should be avoided if possible, as information is lost during compression; however, it is acceptable for purely photographic subjects if the image was generated as a JPEG from the outset.
- Microsoft Office: If you have generated your images in Microsoft Office software (Word, Excel, PowerPoint), or similar software, it is best to send us the files in their native file formats.
- 4. Please ensure all images are a minimum of 600 dpi.
- 5. Please also submit a short description of the image or the work it represents.
- 6. As this is a publishing service for authors, we do ask authors to contribute to the publication costs (see the CCC form).

5. APPENDIX

Publication Charges

Color figures are published online free of charge. Page Charges: The journal does not charge for publication.

Conflict of Interest

The journal requires that all authors disclose any potential sources of conflict of interest. Any interest or relationship, financial or otherwise that might be perceived as influencing an author's objectivity is considered a potential source of conflict of interest. These must be disclosed when directly relevant or directly related to the work that the authors describe in their manuscript. Potential sources of conflict of interest include, but are not limited to: patent or stock ownership, membership of a company board of directors, membership of an advisory board or committee for a company, and consultancy for or receipt of speaker's fees from a company. The existence of a conflict of interest does not preclude publication. If the authors have no conflict of interest to declare, they must also state this at submission. It is the responsibility of the corresponding author to review this policy with all authors and collectively to disclose with the submission ALL pertinent commercial and other relationships.

Authorship

The list of authors should accurately illustrate who contributed to the work and how. All those listed as authors should qualify for authorship according to the following criteria:

- 1 Have made substantial contributions to conception and design, or acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data; and
- 2 Been involved in drafting the manuscript or revising it critically for important intellectual content; and
- 3 Given final approval of the version to be published. Each author should have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for appropriate portions of the content; and
- 4 Agreed to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.
- 5 Contributions from anyone who does not meet the criteria for authorship should be listed, with permission from the contributor, in an Acknowledgments section (for example, to recognize contributions from people who

provided technical help, collation of data, writing assistance, acquisition of funding, or a department chairperson who provided general support). Prior to submitting the article all authors should agree on the order in which their names will be listed in the manuscript.

Additional Authorship Options: Joint first or senior authorship: In the case of joint first authorship, a footnote should be added to the author listing, e.g. 'X and Y should be considered joint first author' or 'X and Y should be considered joint senior author.'

6. POST PUBLICATION, PROMOTION

When the article is published online,

- The author receives an email alert (if requested).
- The link to the published article can be shared through social media.
- The author will have free access to the paper (after accepting the Terms & Conditions of use, they can view the article).
- The corresponding author and co-authors can nominate up to ten colleagues to receive a publication alert and free online access to the article.
